Dane County COVID-19 Emergency and Recovery Fund

United Way 211 - Help Starts Here

There are services available in the greater community to help get you through the COVID-19 pandemic. This may be a first for you, to ask for assistance, but please don't hesitate to reach out. United Way 211 is a free, confidential information and referral resource available via telephone (voice or text) 24 hours a day, every day. It covers the entire state and you reach a "live" resource specialist by simply calling 211 on your telephone or texting your zip code to 898-211. The person answering will be able to help you navigate this current situation (which is changing every day)! If you prefer, the information is also available online at <https://211wisconsin.org/>.

Unemployment Insurance

If laid off or furloughed, apply ONLINE - there are no paper forms or telephone options - for Unemployment Insurance. [And, just a warning, the highest benefit right at this time is \$370 a week and the wages are taxed!]

To apply, go to <https://dwd.wisconsin.gov/uiben/apply/>. They also have a section with frequently asked questions on the side. For now, a "claimant" will have to register online/create an account with the Job Center of Wisconsin (www.JobCenterofWisconsin.com) which includes uploading a resume. It is recommended that a person uses the same user ID and password for both Unemployment Insurance AND the Job Center of Wisconsin.
